### Development Approval for Proposed Renewable Energy Facility (Wind Measurement Mast)

Council has approved an application for proposed renewable energy facility (wind measurement mast) to conduct climatic monitoring on Morawa – Yalgoo Road. The application meets all structural, mechanical, advertising and local government conditions outlined and is noted that any future 'wind farm' proposal on the property would be subject to a separate future application.

The Shire's planning team will be seeking community thoughts regarding local planning policies around carbon farming and renewable energy uses.

#### **Road Works**


Maintenance grading is continuing around the Shire, we are currently focusing on the Gutha and Canna area.


As well as focusing on maintenance tasks on the aerodrome and replacing the manhole lid on the Croot Street footpath.
